Dear ICANN,

We understand that .kids could be a possible global generic Top-Level Domain (gTLD) under the new gTLD application program. Since the “.kids” platform may have a great impact on children worldwide, we as a part of the NGO community concerning the well-being of children therefore hope that the future .kids registry could follow the below guiding principles:

- Adopt the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child (UNCRC) as a fundamental guiding principle to protect the rights of children;
- Operate a viable not-for-profit initiative to develop .kids as a global domain promoting kids-friendly content on the Internet;
- Promote the well being of children online and children’s rights;
- Value children’s participation on Internet governance by making .kids a platform for children and multi-stakeholder to build a better Internet world together; and
- Support child-right organizations and initiatives around the world, especially with relevance to the development of the Internet with the best interests of the child as a fundamental principle.
